Tue 06 December 2016 Australia – Yangon

Morning departure from Australia on Thai Airways flights via Bangkok to Yangon arriving in the evening. After immigration, luggage collection and customs transfer to the hotel.

Wed 07 Dec Yangon – Mandalay

Check-out from the hotel and transfer to the airport for a mid-morning flight to Mandalay. On arrival enjoy lunch in a local restaurant followed by a visit to the Shwenandaw Monastery, famous for its intricate wood-carvings.

Continue to the Mandalay Palace, the royal palace of the last Burmese monarchy constructed between 1857 and 1859 as part of King Mindon's founding of the new royal capital city of Mandalay. 3 1

Embarkation

Thu 08 Dec Mandalay – Mingun – Kyaungmyaung

After a morning at leisure transfer to the Anawrahta for embarkation. Enjoy lunch on board while the ship casts off. In the early afternoon visit Mingun, the site of the uncompleted Pahtodawgyi pagoda, a monumental uncompleted stupa began by King Bodawpaya in 1790. The completed stupa would have been the largest in the world at 150 meters and has the largest ringing bell weighing 90 tons.

Enjoy a welcome aboard dinner with a performance of Burmese traditional costumes.

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Fri 09 Dec

Kyaungmyaung – Tagaung

After passage of the Third Defile, arrive at Kyaungmyaung, which is famous for its manufacture of large glazed earthenware pots known as Martaban jars. The biggest of these jars can hold about 105 gallons (over 400 litres). Late in the afternoon sail past the beautiful island pagoda of Thihadaw toward Tagaung.

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Sat 10 Dec

Tagaung – Katha

In the morning, visit the ancient city of Tagaung. This town plays a key role in Myanmar folklore, with chronicles mentioning it as the first capital of Myanmar and therefore the place in which all subsequent kingdoms are rooted. One of the main sights in town is the shrine of a powerful nat (spirit) named Tagaung Bo Bo Gyi and is considered by worshippers to be the most powerful spirit in Myanmar. 3 1 0

Sun II Dec

Katha – Shwegu

In the morning, take a trishaw to explore the enchanting colonial town of Katha. Katha is the site of George Orwell's famous book *Burmese Days*, a story of what life was like in a remote station during the colonial era. The town is still charming with its teak homes and quaint streets.

In the afternoon, take a small boat to visit Shwegu, a long ribbon of township that stretches for three miles along the river bank. The village lies at the end of the spectacular second Shwegu and features large family potteries making unglazed earthenware pots employing a technique of throwing and beating. **(3)**

Mon 12 Dec

$Shwegu-Bhamo-Shwe\ Paw$

Today, cruise from Shwegu toward Bhamo, where the river cuts its way with narrow channels through a beautiful gorge with high cliffs and thick forests. This is known as the Second Defile and is the most northerly navigable point on the Irrawaddy. The town is the closest and most accessible point on the river to China (the border is 65km away) and one end of the famous old caravan trail up the Daying Jiang valley which Marco Polo followed in the 13th century, a route still in use today. Explore the local market often filled with ethnic tribes such as Kachin, Lisu and Shan. This evening cruise down river and anchor at Shwe Paw. 3

Tue 13 Dec

Shwe Paw – Katha

In the morning, visit the picturesque island of Shwe Paw and its ancient pagodas. Then continue cruising to visit the riverside village of Mae Dar before cruising downstream toward Katha. 3 5 5

Wed I4 Dec

Katha – Kyanhnydat

In the morning, take a train to the forest station of Naba and journey into the thick Kachin jungle and teak forests. Back on board and enjoy cruising with a nice river view.

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Thu I5 Dec

Kyanhnydat – Mandalay

In the morning, cruise to Thabeitkyin and take a tour to Mogok. Mogok has been famous since ancient times for its gemstones, especially ruby and sapphire, but semiprecious stones such as lapis lazuli, garnet, moonstone, peridot and chrysoberyl are also found. The gems are found in alluvial limestone gravels by means of panning, tunnelling and digging pits by hand. You will be driven further into a Burmese teak forest to meet working elephants. In the afternoon the ship will sail downstream toward Mandalay. 3

Fri 16 Dec Mandalay

Arrive Mandalay in the early morning. After breakfast, taking a tour by horse cart to visit the ancient city of Ava founded in 1364 by King Thadomin as his capital. Little remains of the old city. In its place stands the Maha Aungmye Bonzan Monastery and the Mae Nu Oak Kyaung, with their fine examples of Myanmar masonry, art and architecture.

Following lunch at a local restaurant visit the Sagaing Hills. Enjoy the spectacular panoramic views and stop by the convent, Soon U Ponya Shin Pagoda. Drive onto Amarapura and visit a textile workshop before enjoying sunset at the U Bein Bridge, the longest and oldest teakwood bridge in the world. 3

Sat 17 Dec Mandalay – Bagan

Late morning visit Yandabo, a remote village by the river bank. It is famous for the production of terracotta pottery made from river bank mud and view the pottery making process at various stages. Yandabo is also famous

in Burmese history as the place where the Treaty of Yandabo was signed in 1855 between the Burmese king and the British. 3 1 0

Sun 18 Dec Bagan

After a stunning sunrise and leisurely breakfast you reach magnificent Bagan, the capital city of Burma from 1044 to 1287, famed worldwide for two treasures: the endless plains studded with ancient Buddhist pagodas and its exquisite lacquer ware. This plain east of the curving Ayeyarwady is one of the most wondrous sights in Myanmar. Visit several of the 3,000 listed monuments, including DhammayazikaPaya, with its amazing view from the terrace, and the biggest temple, Dhammayangyi – both built in the 12th century – and one of the best preserved of all Bagan temples, the 11th–century Ananda.

(Optional Mt. Popa tour in the afternoon).

Tonight, celebrate the conclusion of the cruise with a traditional puppet show. 3 1 0

Mon 19 Dec

Bagan – Yangon

Disembark the Anawrahta and transfer to Bagan Airport for a short flight to Yangon, for overnight.

Tonight, celebrate the conclusion of the tour with a special farewell dinner. 3 0

Tue 20 Dec

Depart Yangon

Tour arrangements conclude after breakfast.

There will be a transfer to Yangon Airport for suggested afternoon departure on Thai Airways to Bangkok, connecting with overnight flights to Australia.

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
Wed 21 Dec

Anawrahta

Launched in 2015 the Anawrahta has a total of 16 deluxe cabins (32 sqm.) and 6 suites (50 - 58 - 84 sqm.). With the largest cabin space the Anawrahta is the perfect vessel on which to explore the mighty Ayeyarwady River. Built to resemble a British colonial paddle steamer the elegant 65 metre vessel features three spacious desks.

All cabins and suites have queen or king size beds and include safe, shower/WC, wardrobe, desk and chair and balcony. Executive and Royal Suites also feature a larger bathroom with bath/shower and armchairs in the sitting area as well as a larger balcony and panoramic window.

The Anawrahta features the Kipling bar, elegant Hintha Hall Restaurant, the Mandalay Lounge and a full-length sun deck with deck-chairs, jacuzzi pool and navigation bridge. Other services include a gym and a spa.






















Executive Suite layout

HOW TO BOOK

Complete, sign and return the Booking Form available from Renaissance Tours with your deposit and page one of your passport.

DEPOSIT / FINAL PAYMENTS

Your deposit is due at the time of booking and is used to pay hotel, airline, performance tickets and/ or other deposits. It is non-refundable in the event of your cancellation.

Final payment is due 60 days before departure. Failure to make the final payment by the due date may result in cancellation of your booking and loss of deposit.

Payment by cash, cheque, direct deposit, American Express, MasterCard and Visa is accepted. I.5% service charge applies to payment made by MasterCard and Visa. 3% service charge applies to payment made by American Express.

Payments for some international airfares can be made by credit card without a service fee. Please check for details.

CANCELLATION & REFUNDS

a) Cancellation by You – Cancellation charges will be applied as shown below, calculated from the day written notification is received by Renaissance Tours. In addition to cancellation fees for tours operated by Renaissance Tours as shown below, airlines, hotels and other third parties may impose up to 100% cancellation charges.

PASSPORTS, VISAS AND VACCINATIONS

All travellers must be in a possession of a valid passport — most countries require a 6-month validity from your date of entry or exit. For some countries (e.g. China, Vietnam, India, Russia), visas are included in the tour cost and will be arranged by Renaissance Tours prior to travel. For other countries, it is your responsibility to ensure you have the appropriate visa(s).

You are also responsible for obtaining all necessary inoculations and preventative medicines as may be required for the duration of the tour.

TOUR PRICES

Prices quoted in our tour information are based on exchange rates, cost of services and applicable taxes at the time of publication. Prices may be subject to change in the event of significant currency fluctuations or the introduction of new taxes, up until final payment is received.

In the event of a price increase, whether because of a currency fluctuation, increase in taxes or a correction in advertised prices, we will advise you and you have the option of accepting the amended prices, inclusions and booking conditions or withdrawing from the tour and receiving a full refund of all monies paid.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

It is a condition of travel that you are covered by comprehensive travel insurance for international tours. Your travel insurance can be arranged by Renaissance Tours.

FITNESS AND PARTICIPATION

Most of our tours require a MODERATE level of fitness.

However, in certain destinations (e.g. Silk Road, Central Asia, Outback Australia, tropical destinations) or in certain seasons (e.g. mid-winter, mid-summer) or because of the nature of travel (e.g. remote rail), certain tours will require an ABOVE AVERAGE or CHALLENGING level of fitness.

If you (or we) have any doubts about your level of fitness, you may be required to have a doctor's appraisal. This would require your doctor to read the itinerary of your chosen tour, including the fitness level, and provide you (and us) with a written confirmation of your ability to participate.

MODERATE

For the overall benefit of the group, all tour members must possess a moderate level of mobility, including the ability to:

- negotiate airports and railway stations without wheelchair assistance
- use combined shower/bath facilities (it is impossible to guarantee walk-in shower facilities)
- undertake walking tour of I-2 hours duration, including using stairs, walking over cobblestones and other uneven surfaces
- stand for long periods in museums and other sites
- embark / disembark coaches, trains and other methods of transportation without assistance
- handle your own luggage

ABOVE AVERAGE

In addition to the above, tour members must also be able to:

- undertake walking tours of 2–3 hours
- climb staircases of 100 or more steps

CHALLENGING

In addition to the above, tour members must also be able to:

- handle extremes of temperature (e.g. below 0 or above 35 degrees)
- handle extremes of altitudes (e.g. 4000 metres and above).
